# Health and worship at Plymouth

Plymouth is doing some things to help out in the current flu and cold environment. We already serve Communion as individual pieces of bread and cups, so we don't need to alter how we do that. Starting in November, we put hand sanitizers in the sanctuary for you to use as you enter. Some members have very real concerns about their immune systems and health risks, so we ask that all of us be sensitive to the needs of others: make sure our hands are clean, shake hands only with those who offer to do so, and be considerate of those who do not wish to shake hands. The Executive Council feels that the Passing of the Peace is too important a part of our Sunday worship experience and Christian fellowship to cease doing it, so we ask that we all work together to make it as safe and free of anxiety as possible. And of course, no one is obligated to make heroic efforts to be at worship if they feel sick or under the weather (or in the winter, if the roads are dangerous)—please make sure to also take care of yourselves!

### Weather cancellation policy

In the interest of conserving life by stopping members from risking their lives when weather conditions make travel dangerous, and to also help emergency vehicles, plows, etc., by keeping unnecessary traffic off the roads, the Executive Council adopts the following policy on canceling worship services due to inclement weather:

For Sunday morning worship services, the Moderator and Pastor shall consult and make a decision by 7:00 A.M. on Sunday morning. For other worship services or events, the Moderator and Pastor will decide via consultation within four hours of the starting time. If a decision is made to cancel, notification shall be put on the church website, announced by email, radio and television, and on our church's answering machine.


Moderator Memo continued Plymouth Church's Annual Meeting for all congregational members will be on Sunday, January 31, following our regularly scheduled worship service.

Nancy called the meeting to order and opened with devotional reading. The October Council minutes were reviewed and accepted.

#### **Financial Reports:**

#### **Treasurer's Report:**

Income this month was \$10,660.37 expenses were \$10,768.18 leaving us with October loss of \$107.81 and a check book balance of -\$47.57. Some larger expenses were the payment of the lawn mowing of \$1,100.00, \$959.70 of the Food Pantry offering and quarterly pension payment of \$1,716.63. The lawn mowing and Food Pantry are now caught up. Part of the income this month was \$4,600 from the Reserve Fund. We still have not paid any of our OCWM or special offerings to the Conference.

#### **Memorial Fund Report:**

The balance for the end of the month is \$6,884.93. We still owe the Memorial Fund \$1,697.35 from the General Fund.

#### **Building Fund Report:**

The balance for the end of October is \$30,214.25.

Financial reports were reviewed and accepted.

#### **Christian Education Commission:**

The commission thanks the Welk family for the Memorial Money. They think it will be used to send the kids to camp for the next several years. The Halloween Spooktacular was a big success. There were 28 "kids" that came out for the event. The Sunday School kids have spent 3 weeks making crafts for the bazaar as part of a lesson on Stewardship.

#### **Stewardship Commission:**

Larry and Pastor David showed us a revised design for the banner and also a second design. The committee will now meet to recommend a design. They met with the curator at the Chippewa Valley Museum, to get more information about an artifact case. The Stewardship campaign starts the week of Nov. 16. Only a couple of mailings will go out. Since the Building Fund pledge is over, they are hoping those people will put that additional amount into the General Fund. The pot luck on December 6 will be the Stewardship dinner. The mixed nuts are here and will be available at the Bazaar. Only 14 to 16 of the Younkers books were sold. They are having another event in spring, so we may try again. They will have a proposed budget for the next meeting. When asked who would return on the committee for this coming year, only Keith Zehms agreed.

#### **Worship Commission:**

Barb reported that the new oil candles are in and look good. Thank you to the Stygar family for that memorial money. Advent decorating will be Dec 5. Poinsettias and wreaths can be ordered through December 2. There was an order form in the last newsletter. Cyndi has resigned as chair person; Barb will fill out her term and next year. Christmas Eve service was moved to 6 P.M this year so that Cyndi would be able to be there, as she has to be in Bloomer for the 4:30 service.

The annual meeting for the Northwest Association will be at First Congregational on April 25. A proposed restructuring of the Conference is on the website, wcucc.org. Anyone that is interested can look at that. Pastor David also came up with a bad weather policy and the council reviewed it and okayed it. He will publish it in the newsletter and on the website. There have been some concerns about the flu season and the Passing of the Peace during the service. It was decided that aspect of the service is very important.
