Pastor's Pen

Dear Friends,

As we prepare for our 125th anniversary celebration, I've been reading through the history book that was made in 1985 for the 100th anniversary. While many of the people mentioned in the text and shown in photos have passed on to eternal life with the Lord they served while on this earth, we do have many who are still around. It has pictures of the Lowrys, the Sexters, and Bill Knight as well as a photo of Jerry Tubbs at a veterans appreciation dinner shortly after WWII. Many choir pictures that include Esther Lee, Ardith Starr, Kay and Dorothy Gilbertson, and Paul Gilbertson directing the choir while he was a student at UW-EC. Photos of dinners and bazaars and other celebrations. And one that I find particularly interesting is a photo of the church choir from the 1930s—almost 80 years ago!—that includes two people who are still with us: Dorothy Preston and Sophie Bliss.

The history of our church is a story of hundreds of faithful people called by the Holy Spirit to be Christ's church in Eau Claire. And for each person who gets a mention in the history book, there are many others who don't. The quietly faithful who maybe didn't do something that history noticed, but who surely left a footprint somewhere that God saw and cherished. It's also a story of all the dynamics of a diverse group of people: discussions and arguments about where to build and when, financial struggles, restructuring of committees, and facing challenges of growing technology, changing economics, the growth and decline of industry in Eau Claire, and the many other decisions that need to be made about worship, decorations, fellowship, fund raisers, and stewardship. But as the narrative reads, whatever was happening in the church and the community, the congregation was held together with the glue of mutual concern for one another, love

for God and neighbor, and the sense that they were doing something greater than themselves.

As we've been reading about this summer in the Book of Acts, when people are brought together by the Holy Spirit they can withstand any challenge, whether it be the Roman Empire or the closing of Uniroyal, and changing demographics and spiritual inclinations of Eau Claire. Plymouth has been bringing the light of Christ to this city for 125 years, and I imagine it will do so for many more, long after we are gone, and at a time when it will probably look no more like we do now than we look like the first gathering of the faithful who started our congregation in 1885. Who would have thought then that guitars and a Klezmer band would be used in worship, women would be preachers, and children would be liturgists? I don't know what the future holds for us, but I trust that it will continue the story of faithfulness to Christ, love and concern for one another, fellowship shared with food, and the persistence to weather any storm and celebrate together as God's called people as we minister to Eau Claire and the world.

So a big happy 125th anniversary to our congregation! Many thanks to all the saints who went before us to give us the gift of this congregation, and to all you saints who keep it going, and to those who will watch over it in the future.

Executive Council Minutes

August 9, 2010

Larry called the meeting to order. Pastor David opened with a prayer. The July Council minutes were reviewed and approved.

Financial Reports:

Treasurer's Report:

Income this month was \$8848.57; expenses were \$9085.12 leaving us with a July loss of \$236.55 and a check book balance of \$71.11. Part of the income this month was a \$4000.00 withdrawal from the Reserve Fund. Some of the larger expenses were: a tax payment of \$362.96, pension of \$1716.63. As of the end of June our envelope giving was up about \$4882. We also collected \$131.50 for OCWM and \$296 for the food pantry and those amounts will be forwarded in August.

Reserve Fund Report:

The Reserve Fund has a balance of \$422.44 at the end of July. There will be more interest deposits in September.

Memorial Fund Report:

The balance for the end of the month is \$5,621.94

Building Fund Report:

Balance for the end of July is \$26,516.41

Financial reports were reviewed and accepted.

Christian Education Commission:

VBS is this week, August 10–12. The July movie night was not a great success. They will evaluate for next year.

Stewardship Commission:

They are looking for new ideas for the Pie & Ice Cream Social. Some ideas are having a clown, serving hot dogs for the kids and having ice cream sundaes in addition to pies. They are also looking at advance ticket sales and sales to groups. They are looking into having banners made for Advent and Lent.

Worship Commission:

The Outdoor Worship service will be August 25 at 6:15. S'mores will be served. Joe Gilbertson will be helping with the service. For Rally Day on Sept. 12, Rev Jeanny House will speak and we will have special music from The Klezmazel.
