Some nice changes are coming for our SCRIP program here at Plymouth. Until now, we have sold SCRIP cards from Mega and Gordy's, but they had to be ordered a week ahead of time. Mega and Gordy's give us a 3% discount* and Kwik Trip will give us a 10% discount! (*During February, March and April, Gordy's has increased our discount to 5%.) PASTOR'S PEN



Dear friends and family of Plymouth,

Darrick Carter, George and Kay Stecher, and I are learning about how to be a fruitful congregation. Our first meeting with our trainer, Julie (from the Osseo UCC), was about Radical Hospitality. We are good at that, and our trainer was impressed with the hospitality of our building and grounds and our members.

We learned that hospitality begins with simple things like inviting someone to church. Most people who come to church do so because of an invitation (sometimes from the pastor, most times a member). Also important is inviting visitors to enjoy coffee and snacks before worship, and pointing out the bathrooms.

We learned that some church's hospitality includes rocking chairs in the sanctuary for mothers with babies. Or things like unlocking all the entrance doors, especially double doors like ours. (Speaking personally, I consistently choose the locked

one at double doors, and it does get frustrating). Providing first-time visitors name tags then making official ones so they have it when they return. Inviting a visitor to lunch after worship. Taking cookies to their home. Sending a letter of thanks for visiting. Having the sanctuary at a comfortable temperature and music that is singable and meaningful.

My number one lesson is this: how someone experiences our hospitality is how they will experience Christ. I am glad the Christ we offer, through greetings and the content of our worship, is a friendly and inviting Christ of love and grace. We have made and will make some changes. We also ask that you all say "hello" to visitors and help them with directions, wear your nametags, and be the welcoming people you already are.

February 13, 2012

Barb called the meeting to order. The January Council minutes were approved as written.

Financial Reports:

Memorial Fund Balance	\$6,720.42

Treasurer's Report:

Income this month was \$8,524.29, expenses were \$9,181.11; leaving us with a January loss of \$656.82 and a check book balance of –\$651.55. In February monies were transferred from the Nut Fund to cover this negative balance.

Reserve Fund Report:

Balance of \$394.63 at the end of January.

Memorial Fund Report:

The balance for the end of January is \$6,720.42. Amount for General Fund of \$1,200 will be transferred to General in February.

Building Fund Report:

The balance remains \$10,827.58.

Financial reports were reviewed and accepted.

Christian Education Commission:

The February Film Festival will continue through the end of the month. Thanks to all who loaned movies to us. All money raised goes to help our campers go to Moon Beach this summer. There will be no Sunday School for Youth on Feb. 19. The Youth helped promote the Souper Bowl of Caring on Feb. 5. Thanks to the congregation for donating \$378.00 to be given to the St. Francis Food Pantry. Well done!

Stewardship Commission:

Met Feb 12. Ash Wednesday's meal will be soup, bread, and bars. The Thrift Sale will be April 27 and 28 (tentative). SCRIP will be pre-funded so you will be able to receive your cards on the same day you order. Kwik Trip cards, with 10% of purchase going to church, will also be available along with Mega and Gordy's cards.

Worship Commission:

Lenten services were discussed. The theme will be "The Lord's Prayer." Services will begin at 6:00 with a soup supper and discussion at 7:00 each Wednesday, including Ash Wednesday. Changes to our Sunday morning bulletins: On Communion Sundays, the note in the bulletin will leave out "baptized Christians" and add "interested persons." New bulletins with sign-up sheets included so we will not need pew pads. Easter Sunday will again be at 9:30 A.M.
