Calling all knitters!

The United Church of Christ Scarf Project has put out a call for knit scarves to distribute to people at the General Synod 2013 in July in Long Beach, California. This might seem like a strangely warm climate for scarves, but their intent is to raise awareness and be a witness against bullying and violence. They are asking for brightly colored or rainbowy scarves which they will give to synod attendees in the hopes that strangers (either at Synod or on the streets of Long Beach) will ask about them, at which point the wearer will tell them about the scarf project to raise awareness about violence, and then give the scarf away. They hope to give away 3,000 scarves. Directions are about 60 inches long, 4–6 inches wide, crochet or knit or whatever, any pattern, and material must be brightly colored and rainbowy. If you knit some, bring them to church and let's decorate the sanctuary with them until we ship them off.

I also find myself looking more and more forward to our Thanksgiving Eve worship. It has become a gift that helps my spirit move into a Thanksgiving state of being. If you have not joined us for it before, I urge you to do so. This year we will worship at Truax UCC.

Financial Reports:

Building Fund Report:
