

December 11, 2022

Our Moderator, Barb Kleist called the meeting to order at 11:50 A.M. Minutes from the November meeting were reviewed and accepted as written.

Financial Reports:

As of November 30, 2022
Year to Date Income \$121,148.34
Year to Date Expenses \$123,753.95
Ahead (Behind) \$(\$2,605.61)

Treasurer's Report:

Year to Date envelope income of \$87,045 is \$9,557 more than last year at this time and \$25,044 over the year to date average going back to 2009.

Memorial Fund Balance: \$9,292.88

Reserve Fund Balance: \$9,864.51

The financial reports were reviewed and accepted.

Stewardship:

- Nuts have all been delivered. Larry thinks we made something around \$1,200.
- So far, we have 14 pledges that total \$52,235 for 2023. Thank-you notes will be sent to those who have pledged.

Building and Grounds:

• We need more letters and punctuation symbols for our church sign. Larry will get a price.

- Two trees need to be cut down, and Keith Zehms has already arranged to have that done.
- It was decided to give our housekeeper a \$100 Kwik Trip card and a \$100 Festival card. She has stopped billing us for her labor.
- The glass in the sanctuary fire door has finally been replaced.
- Larry says we need to purchase a "good" snow shovel.

Worship:

- Cindy will hand out candles for "Silent Night" on Christmas Eve.
 She and Linda will light them when the time comes.
- Decorations will be taken down Tuesday, January 10 at 2:00 P.M.

Pastor's Report:

- He reported thanks from the Festival Choir for the use of our building for rehearsals.
- New members will be received December 18, and he has spoken with some folks who came to worship as visitors.
- The Conference Office is downsizing and moving to the Daycholah Center. The facility in DeForest will be sold.

Old Business:

- The "Libraries" are being used and appreciated.
- The "Porch Pot" event with the Eau Claire Garden Club went pretty well. We had a great response and made over \$1500. We hope to do it again next year, and we will advertise more and perhaps hold it a bit earlier.

- The proposed budget for 2023 was reviewed. The Team raised the budget for mowing and voted to give the staff a 4% raise.

Support Local Refugees

Are you wondering how you can support local refugees, particularly from Ukraine? JONAH is collaborating with Welcoming New Neighbors and has determined the best three options at this point to support Ukraine families. 1. Donations are needed directly to the churches welcoming a family, as the biggest financial need is covering the arrival costs, the first three months, and work permits of a family's coming. Contact JONAH to find out who is in need today. 2. Once a family is here the most valuable things they need are social connection and support to find autonomy - that means your time! Contact JONAH to learn more. 3. There is a way to sponsor a family just in name and not monetarily or physically (as all they need is a name to come to the U.S.—may not be our area).
