Some of the federal funding for those on lower incomes has ended and they are finding it harder to afford food for their families. More and more people are using the Community Table for a daily source of good food.

We are still recording our worship service to view on Facebook, for those who feel safer at home or can't make it to worship. Please make sure you are vaccinated and boosted. This makes everyone feel safer and maybe we can get rid of COVID completely. Even after you receive it, make sure you stay safe. It's also not too late for a flu shot! Masks are available at church, for those who would still like to wear one.

Please don't forget our homeless friends. Mike and his crew are out checking on the homeless to make sure they are okay. Please keep them in your prayers. They especially need donations of money, and warm clothing, hooded sweatshirts along with socks, mittens, hats, jackets, and

He'll be here early so he can meet and greet people during coffee time, then he will help lead worship and will preach.

Lent 2023: On Sundays during Lent, our theme is “Looking for love in all the wrong places.” Our scriptures offer many images of where love, grace, and healing can REALLY be found. It is not in the “usual” places, and that is as true for us today as it was for the scriptural authors. Don't we often look for wholeness (or even happiness) in places that offer only temporary “good feelings” and satisfaction? We'll use Lent this year to reflect on and reassess where we are searching for meaning and purpose. See elsewhere for a list of the scripture and the weekly themes.



As we move through Lent, I highly recommend that you join your church family for Sunday worship, and also recommend you join us on Wednesday nights for our soup suppers and discussions. These will be good times of fellowship and will be helpful in our faith journeys. See elsewhere in this newsletter for more on those.

Financial Reports:

Year to Date Income	\$18,067.48
Year to Date Expenses	\$13,028.05
Ahead (Behind)	\$5,039.43

Treasurer's Report:

Year to Date envelope income is well above average. The largest bills paid in January were for building insurance, fire system monitoring, and snow removal for January.

Memorial Fund Balance: \$11,196.88

Reserve Fund Balance: \$9,872.05

Financial reports were reviewed and accepted.

Stewardship:

- Larry gave us a short update of where we stand with pledges. At this point, we're pretty close to last year.

Building and Grounds:

- Larry is working to fix the clock in the fellowship room.
- Mike and Pete will take care of the garbage duties while Larry and Barb are gone.

Worship:

- We have set new times for Ash Wednesday and Maundy Thursday services at 2:00 P.M. as many folks don't like to be out driving after dark.
- George Stecher will be leading Lenten soup suppers on Wednesday

evenings. More details will be available in the March newsletter.

- Easter morning worship will be at 10:30 A.M. with a Muffin Breakfast at 9:30 A.M. Free will offering for the breakfast will be used for camp scholarships if we have any campers.

Pastor's Report:

- He will be attending the Festival of Homiletics May 15–19. We will need pulpit supply for May 21.
- April 22 is the NW Association Annual Meeting in Merrill WI. We are looking for a delegate.
- The Conference Annual Meeting will be June 9–11 at Green Lake Conference Center

Old Business:

- Our libraries are doing well, but we need more offerings for children.
- A motion was made, seconded, and passed to close the Music Fund account at Wells Fargo. (See addendum) As chair of the Plymouth Investment Plan committee, Larry Kleist has the authority to continue the process and close the account.

New Business:

- Bill and Heidi Sprouse have indicated that they would like to join Plymouth. The Team voted unanimously to accept them as members.
- It was moved, seconded and passed to clean out the garage and pay someone to take away the unwanted items.

Meeting adjourned at 12:18 P.M. Our next meeting will be March 5, 2023 after worship.
