

Food for Thought

Communion will be April 6. We will be serving communion or we will have the sealed cups for you. We will also take our offering for the Community Table. There will be a pot luck—our first cookout! Bring your favorite dish to go with brats and burgers!

We are still recording our worship service to view on Facebook, for those who feel safer at home or can't make it to worship. COVID, RSV, and the flu are still around in our community. Masks are always available at church if you would like to wear one. Flu shots are still recommended this season! The

COVID vacine is still available, along with the RSV vaccine. The CDC is recommending you get a second COVID shot after six months.

Please don't forget our homeless friends. Mike and his crew are out checking on the homeless to make sure they are okay. Please keep them in your prayers. With federal funding being cut, there are very few options for the homeless. We have a collection box in the Gathering area for clothing, or else you can send a check to CVSM, PO Box 51, Eau Claire, WI 54702-0051. Here is a needs list from the Street Ministry: hooded sweatshirts, in larger sizes so that they can layer; sleeping bags and blankets; men's underwear-new is preferred in all sizes. Also, monetary gifts are very welcome. They purchase city bus passes to provide those that need transportation to work or appointments. Also if they need some items not donated, they have to purchase them.

Also, don't forget our Birthday Challenge. We are challenging you to make a donation in your birthday month corresponding to your age. The money will be put toward our next big repair project. April birthdays, it's your turn!

Come and visit our libraries. We have one curbside for anyone to use and we've started one inside in Fellowship Hall. Different books are added frequently.

If anyone knows of a family member or member of this congregation who is in the hospital, please let the church office know. Unless someone tells us, we don't know if you're in the hospital. Also, make sure the hospital knows you belong to Plymouth UCC. On the same subject, we would like emergency contacts for all our members. The meeting was called to order at 11:45 A.M. The minutes of the last meeting were reviewed and accepted after one correction was made.

Financial Reports:

Treasurer's Report:

Profits from the sale of nuts in 2024 will be transferred from Scrip/Nut checking to General Fund. Payments to OCWM and Community Table will get caught up at the end of the first quarter.

Memorial Fund Balance: \$6,995.34

Reserve Fund Balance: \$24,024.70

Financial reports were reviewed and accepted.

New Business:

Pastor David was given the floor, and he presented his letter of resignation to the Leadership Team. He has accepted a call to a UCC congregation in Hawaii. Yuki will join him there and they will finally be able to be together permanently. His last Sunday with Plymouth will be May 4. A copy of Pastor David's letter will be emailed/mailed to the congregation in the coming week.

Barb passed out literature from the Conference regarding the call process. The Leadership Team will draft a letter to the congregation to explain the process and ask for volunteers for the Search Committee. Because there will most likely be a lot going on May 4, the Team decided to move communion to April 27.

Meeting adjourned at 12:25 P.M. Our next meeting will be Sunday, March 23, 2025 after worship.
